



Imbalance continues in Licence applications

Only one club from the Welsh Football League has applied for the FAW Domestic Licence this season, meaning that Haverfordwest County are the only side that can be promoted from the South in May. **Writes Andrew Howard** They are currently in fifth and enjoying a more consistent run of form in both the League and Welsh Cup of late. Established former Welsh Premier League players like Jack Christopher, Chris Holloway, Lee Bevan and Liam Hancock have all been brought in this season to realise the Pembrokeshire club's ambitions of getting back into the Welsh Premier, but it remains difficult.

The Bluebirds missed out on goal difference last season, with the decisive match being played after the County's final game. I'm a strong believer in League's finishing on the same day for Fair Play and integrity reasons, so let's hope that when they kick their final ball this season, there is no uncertainty for Haverfordwest about which League they will play their football in, in 2013/14.

The Huws Gray Alliance tells a different story and it's pleasing to report that there have been six applications from the North. Rhyl FC are setting the pace and have applied for the licence, having been successful for the first time last year upon appeal. Second-placed Caersws have not applied however, but Micky Evans' team will push all the way for the Championship.

Cefn Druids and Flint Town are both in the top six and they have both also applied for the licence and promotion, whilst Llandudno Town, Porthmadog and Buckley Town have all applied, but a top-two finish already looks unlikely for that progressive trio. I hope that they are still determined to gain the licence at the end of the year though.

When compiling a basic SWOT analysis of the Welsh Premier, it's evident that one of the biggest Threats to the League is stagnation. Promotion and relegation keeps Leagues in all sport healthy, rugby Union's Celtic League has suffered badly from not having this. But the Welsh Premier League shouldn't and although it's important to remain neutral in this job, I sincerely hope that Haverfordwest finish in the top two in the Welsh League, with Rhyl, Cefn Druids or Flint Town doing the same in the Huws Gray Alliance.

Bala on the European trail(er)!



A football club's quest for European glory has been boosted by the continent's biggest trailer maker.

High flying Bala Town FC have secured sponsorship from Ifor Williams Trailers for what's being billed as the biggest game of the season.

The top of the table clash against Bangor City will take place at the Maes Tegid ground on Saturday, December 22.

As part of the sponsorship package, five members of staff whose names have been drawn out of a hat, along with a guest, will be given VIP treatment on match day.

Ifor Williams Trailers spokesman Daniel Burton said they were delighted to have the opportunity to sponsor such an important game.

He said: "Bala Town are a club that's really going places – and, given the nature of our product, that's something we can really relate to.

"With our headquarters in Cynwyd, the company has its roots in this part of rural North Wales.

"Like Bala Town, we feel we are part of the fabric of the community so we were particularly keen to show our support in a tangible way. We'd like to wish the team all the very best for the game against Bangor City and I'm sure it will be a memorable day for the five members of staff and their guests who will be attending on our behalf."

The club's twin ambitions this year are to win the Welsh Premier League and to qualify for Europe after last year's heartbreak when they narrowly lost out on a Europa Cup spot.

The Lakesiders have come a long way since Manager Colin Caton – cousin of the late Manchester City and Arsenal star, Tommy Caton – took over 10 years ago, after a successful semi-professional playing career with Rhyl, Colwyn Bay and Witton Albion.

He recalled: "When I came here, Bala Town was just an open playing field really and there's been a lot of work being put in by everybody doing paths and stands and floodlights and the like to meet the ground criteria.

“Our aim is to get into Europe. We were nearly there last year but we hit the post twice in the final play-off of the European qualifying game.

“We lost 2-1 in the final against Llanelli who have been more or less a full time outfit for the last six or seven years. They’ve won the Welsh Premier so for us to come and compete with the likes of them is a massive achievement.

“We had 70 per cent of the play really and their goalkeeper got man of the match. He was outstanding.” According to Colin, the first couple of seasons in the Welsh Premier League were a struggle because of financial constraints caused by the need for ground improvements.

The squad includes players who have experienced the game at the highest level with the likes of ex-Everton right back John Irving and former Wales international Mark Jones, along with Lee Hunt who’s rated as one of the deadliest strikers in the league.

Colin said: “Last season we had the most successful season that the club’s ever had and finished fourth.

“This season we had a bad start but we are currently lying in fifth spot and things are looking good.

“Everything is improving slowly and we’re looking to kick on now and the Bangor City game being sponsored by Ifor Williams Trailers will be the highest attended game here this season. Bangor always bring a massive following and it’s always a good atmosphere when they come. It’s the most attractive feature in the Welsh Premier. Sponsorship is vitally important, it’s the be all and end all. Without sponsorship and impetus and rewards from local businesses, we wouldn’t be able to compete at this level. I think what we’ve achieved in the three years we’ve been in the Welsh Premier League has been a massive success. As a club, Bala has been the most progressive and the most ambitious in Welsh football in the last seven or eight years.”

It was a sentiment echoed by the club’s Commercial Manager, Gareth Moon, who started out as a fan initially. He said:

“I’m delighted with the progress we’ve made as a club, it’s great for the town, great for businesses and great for the everyday football fan that follows us. It’s put Bala on the map, especially with matches being televised on Sgorio on S4C.

“To have a business like Ifor Williams Trailers come on board is just fantastic for the community. The people who work there come to watch us, people know about them and I would go as far as to say they are world’s biggest trailer manufacturer. We’re just so pleased to have them involved. It’s going to be a great day and a great day for their staff who attend.”

Yes, it’s always sad to see clubs relegated, but Connah’s Quay and Afan Lido are both examples of the beauty of the pyramid system and how you can bounce back.

For clarification, the criteria for promotion is two-pronged. A club must finish as Champions of their respective League and gain the domestic licence. If the champion club doesn’t fulfil this criteria, the Runners Up from that League can be promoted, if they gain the licence. Only one club from each feeder League can be promoted.

The only unanswered question is how are the FAW going to encourage more clubs to apply and reach the criteria from the Welsh League? Well, firstly a consultation process is currently being compiled into a Tier 2 licence and this will reduce the gap between the levels and secondly, it is hoped that the Welsh Ground Improvements can target those clubs which do have ambition to be promoted for infrastructure development. A focused infrastructure investment Policy is fundamental to this.

It's probably quite apt therefore; to say publically how really pleasing it has been to see Gwyn settle into his new role so well. He's made a seamless transition from John Deakin's excellent stewardship and into a new and even more exciting era for the National League. One of Gwyn's objectives from the start has been to foster great relationships with all member clubs from Day 1 and it's pleasing to see and hear the club's respond so positively.

Gwyn will certainly be seen at Welsh Premier League grounds over the Festive Season and he is always keen to have a chat and listen to people's views.

There is a great programme over Christmas to look forward to, with matches to be played on the 21st, 22nd, 23rd, 26th and 29th of December in addition to a quartet of matches to kick-off the New Year in style on New Year's Day.

One of those matches will be televised live by S4C and if last year's festive clash between the clubs' is anything to go by; this will be a real Christmas cracker. The corresponding game last year was the last seen at Farrar Road as Bangor brought down the curtain at the stadium with a 5-3 win. Expect the match at the Bookpeople Stadium to be an even closer affair this time around and with likes of Simm, Parkinson and Price all on the field, goals should also be guaranteed to celebrate the welcoming of a New Year.

The Christmas programme is sure to have a significant impact on the final positions before the split. I think that TNS, Bangor City, Prestatyn Town and Airbus UK have already done enough to book their place in the top-half, whilst Afan Lido and Newtown look destined for a place in the Play-Off conference.

That leaves half the League still firmly in the hunt for the final two places in the Championship Conference. Bala Town and Port Talbot Town currently occupy those positions, but Connah's Quay, Carmarthen, Llanelli and Aberystwyth Town are all hot on their heels. The back-to-back Christmas derbies should tell us a lot and those games alone could rule out either of the Carmarthenshire clubs who face each other twice. Bala Town have the most difficult of matches with a TNS double following this weekend's visit of Bangor City. Port Talbot Town's record against their rivals Afan Lido last season was poor, so that will need to be reverted, whilst Carmarthen's change of fortune could now be hampered by suspensions just as they looked likely to sneak into the Top Six Party.

The situation at Llanelli remains a concern for the Reds' fans, but Bob Jeffrey's side pulled off an outstanding result at Bala last weekend, typifying their Jekyll and Hyde season. In their first season in this structure, the Nomads have done excellently and have been there or thereabouts consistently. They face a tough Flintshire double with Airbus on Boxing Day and New Year's Day, as well as this weekend's trip to TNS, a trip to Bala and their rearranged home game against Prestatyn Town, so a very difficult programme for Mark McGregor's men. After all this I can't sit on the fence and based on the remaining fixtures, I am going to suggest Port Talbot and Carmarthen and it could well go down to goal-difference, which may hamper Aberystwyth's ambitions.
