New additions to FIFA

Bryn Markham-Jones, who originates from Wrexham, but now lives in Swansea has been selected for the FIFA International List of Referees for 2013.

The 25 year old becomes Wales' 40th International referee and joins Lee Evans (Llanllechid) and Mark Whitby (Swansea) on the International list for next year. Bryn replaces Huw Jones from Llanrhaeadr-ym-Mochnant after Jones enjoyed three years as an International referee.

Bryn, who graduated from UWIC three years ago with a BSc in Sports Coaching, is currently studying for a PGCE and his other interests include training, reading, cricket and golf.

Markham-Jones has recently completed the UEFA CORE program held at UEFA headquarters, which is for the development of talented young referees throughout Europe.

He is now in his 4th season as a Welsh Premier League referee and last season, he took charge of the FAW Trophy Final and the North East Wales Cup Final.

He was also 4th official on the 2011 Welsh Cup Final at Parc Y Scarlets, when Llanelli beat Bangor City.

Markham-Jones started refereeing at the age of 16 in the Wrexham Youth League before progressing up the pyramid to the Welsh Premier League at the age of 22. Another notable appointment was being the 4th official on the 2011 FAW Welsh Cup Final.

So in the space of nine years, the talented referee has gone from the parks of the Wrexham Youth League to the International List, which shows the potential on offer to young referees in Wales

There is also one change to the Welsh FIFA Assistant Referee list as Caernarfon's **Gareth Wyn Jones** replaces Cardiff's Kim Fisher on the FIFA Panel. Fisher has to step down, as he is now a Talent Referee on the Welsh Premier League and Jones has been selected as Wales' sixth assistant referee for his place on the International list for the first time.

Jones has also graduated through UEFA's CORE programme, having been one of two assistants from Wales on the inaugural course in 2010/11. His excellent form last season saw him awarded the role of assistant on the Welsh Cup Final at Nantporth in the TNS v Cefn Druids match and he has continued his excellent form this term.

Another interesting fact about the two new FIFA officials is that they are both Welsh speakers.

- Budding Banksies can prime their spraycans and get ready for a Graffiti Arts Workshop to be held at The Book People Stadium Nantporth from 10am – 4 pm on 10 January. This event is for ages 16+ and it's a great and exciting opportunity to learn new skills and explore new creative outlets.
- It's been a busy time for City's Community programme, as working in partnership with GroundWork North Wales, with funding through Britvic, seven raised beds have been planted within The Book People Stadium. Three days of hard work from staff and volunteers of GroundWork and Bangor City Community Sports resulted in the finished product now brightening up the Bangor end of the ground
- Also recently, Bangor City Community Sports in partnership with the Derwen project have been delivering disability football sessions at Ysgol Yr Hendre in Caernarfon. These sessions see participants from across Gwynedd with different learning disabilities come together, have fun and develop new skills under the tutelage of professional coaches. We are looking at establishing a junior disability football team in the area as a result of the success of these sessions.
- Finally, we've just appointed our first Community Coach, Iwan Jones from Llanrug. Iwan's post is funded by Jobs Growth Wales and he will be with City for 26 weeks in the first place. First move of 2013... Mark Jones: Lido > Aber

Aberystwyth Town are delighted to confirm the signing of young centre forward Mark Jones from Afan Lido.

The Black and Greens beat off interest from four other clubs to land Jones' signature, and after a meeting with club officials on New Years Eve, he signed a contract which will see him play a key part in Aberystwyth Town's fortunes until June 2014.

This was the first major transfer of the Welsh Premier League window, and Aberystwyth Town took the League by surprise by naming Jones in today's line up at Newtown. Jones scored on his debut at Latham Park, and his performance certainly justified the high regard in which he is held throughout the Welsh Premier League.

Mark was a product of the Afan Lido youth system before he spent time with the Cardiff City academy, before returning to Lido where he top scored in the club's Welsh League campaign.

He then joined Llanelli in September 2007 and won a Welsh Premier League Winners medal during their Championship winning season.

He returned to Lido on loan a year later, rejoining the Reds in January 2009, but was released in the summer, moving to Port Talbot Town. He had trials during the summer 2007 with several league clubs in England including Millwall.

He again returned to Afan Lido in October 2009 and was the top-scorer in their promotion campaign from the Welsh League to the WPL.

After his debut this afternoon Mark spoke to the official Welsh Premier League website and said:

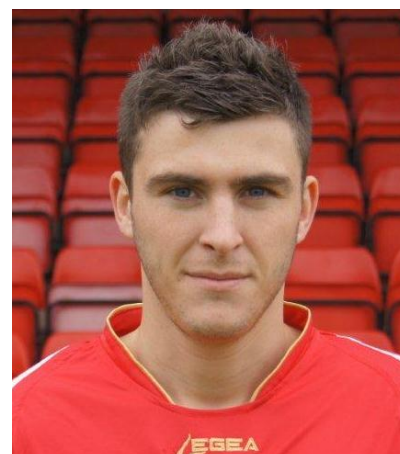
"The result today wasn't what we were hoping for but Aber are a good club and I'm very happy to have signed for them. I was at Llanelli with Wyn Thomas and Jordan Follows and they told me that Aberystwyth is a well-run club and that I'd be happy there if I signed. The top six seems to be out of our reach now - but we'll do all that we can to finish seventh and mount a charge for Europe that way."

In welcoming Mark to the club, Aberystwyth Town would like to place on record their appreciation to Afan Lido FC for their cooperation in releasing Mark in time to play this afternoon.

The Black and Greens have also released left back Adam Worton to Newtown.

Chad Bond rejoins Port Talbot

Chad Bond returns for a second spell at the GenQuip stadium.

The well-travelled striker moves to the GenQuip stadium following a spell in the United States with LA Blues, having formerly featured for a host of clubs including Newport County, Neath and Llanelli.

Bond originally joined the Steelmen in 2006 from Swansea City, where he enjoyed a successful 18-month stint before returning to the Liberty Stadium later following the appointment of Roberto Martinez. He would later have loan spells in both Spain and Sweden with CF Balaguer and Ostersunds FK respectively.

The 25-year-old has already been training with the Port Talbot squad prior to signing and could be in Scott Young's match-day squad to face Bala Town next Saturday at the GenQuip stadium.

Port Talbot Town will close in on a top-six finish should they record their third-straight win at the expense of Bala Town on Saturday (2:30).

Convincing back-to-back victories against rivals Afan Lido over the festive period have powered the Steelmen into fifth-place in the table, but Port Talbot manager Scott Young has mounting selection worries to contend with ahead of the Lakesiders' visit to the GenQuip stadium.

Young will be forced into making three changes from the side which emphatically overcame Afan Lido 6-1 last weekend, with Jeff White, Lee John and Daniel Sheehan all serving one-match bans.

Defender James Bloom is expected to make a timely return from suspension, whilst former Neath and Llanelli striker Chad Bond could feature for the first time since re-joining the club this week, following a spell playing in the United States.

Meanwhile, Port Talbot have selected the fixture for their new 'Pay What You Want' initiative, allowing spectators to decide their own admission fee.

Chairman Andrew Edwards hopes that the scheme will help boost the club's recent disappointing attendances.

"We've been disappointed with the lack of support so far this season and the players and management deserve better. We're playing a good standard of football and it's disappointing that the public don't support the Welsh Premier League and its clubs," he said.

"Port Talbot Town are a family-friendly club, we do a lot of work within the community and by running this initiative, we hope to get people in and change their perspective."

Carmarthen Town have released Leon Jeanne to join Welsh League side Taffs Well. He follows Rhys Wilson who moved a few weeks ago.

Lee Bevan, Anthony Finselbach and Jack Christopher have also departed in recent weeks, all to Haverfordwest County

Danny Thomas has retired in order to take up a coaching role at Cardiff City.

Kendall answers Prestatyn's SOS call

Lee Kendall, who once won the Welsh Premier League Title with Rhyl, has answered an SOS call and signed for their Denbighshire neighbours Prestatyn Town.

The Cardiff-based stopper, 31, who announced his retirement in the summer to focus on his exciting coaching career, was a free agent, having left Neath at the end of last season, when his contract expired and he was therefore able to sign outside the transfer window.

Regular incumbent Jon Hill-Dunt was injured on December 22nd in the 5-2 home defeat to Newtown and his understudy Gareth Barker who played the last hour of that match conceded four goals against the Robins.

Kendall's signing suggests that Hill-Dunt will not be fit for this evening's trip to Bangor City, so Kendall is expected to make his debut this evening at the BookPeople Stadium.

Kendall has previously played in the Welsh Premier League for Neath, Port Talbot Town, Rhyl, Haverfordwest County and Barry Town and has qualified for Europe with all of his clubs.

The former Wales U21 'keeper joins a growing list of South Wales-based goalkeepers to ply his trade at northern clubs, joining Lee Idzi (Bangor City) and Ashley Morris (Bala Town) who live in Merthyr and Tredegar respectively, whilst in the Huws Gray Alliance, Conwy Borough's Kristian Rogers lives in Cardiff.

Prestatyn Chairman is helping others achieve their goals

Prestatyn Town chairman Phil Merrick achieved all of the goals he set out for himself... on and off the pitch, writes Martin Williams of DPW West.

Now aged 58, the Prestatyn Town FC stalwart – who has also played for and managed the Welsh Premier side – is putting something back into the community.

Having retired at just 55, following years in myriad strategy, audit and executive roles with NWS Bank in Chester, the married dad-of-three has his sights set on helping others.

He wants to increase revenue and garner more business support for the Seaside, help unemployed people back into work and through his latest venture - Peoplemad - Phil is aiming to share tips, advice and expertise on personal and professional development.

Proceeds will go to the club, but if the idea takes off it could also become another financial success for the entrepreneurial Leeds United fanatic, who travelled all over the world in past positions and helped set-up and merge companies, as well as troubleshooting at international firms.



Speaking exclusively to Business Post over coffee in one of the town's bustling cafes, he said: "When I retired I looked at getting back into sports and managed a racing car driver for a while.

"I then wanted to be a football agent but when Prestatyn Town asked me to become chairman it was an opportunity I couldn't pass up.

"I'd written a couple of books on Leeds (United) and sport had always been my passion so I thought about combining the knowledge I'd picked up over the years and

combining it with personal development. So I set up Peoplemad."

He added: "When I worked in the bank a lot of my time was spent going around different businesses and speaking to people. It was always more about people than processes.

"Your success is affected by the actions of others, you need to surround yourself with the right people professionally and personally, family and friends. That's what I'm trying to get across."

Now living in Tan Lan, Phil grew up and was schooled in Prestatyn and St Asaph before attending college in London.

He had always wanted to be a footballer and still played while living in the capital, but a blood clot on his knee put him out of action for many months.

On returning to North Wales he began working in the health sector and again took to the pitch, but recurrences of the injury saw him hang up his boots at 28 years old and eventually turn to management where he led teams including Meliden, Colwyn Bay and the high-flying Bastion Road outfit.

Banking and business saw priorities change and his career came first for a while, but in his heart Phil always believed he'd be back. And Phil's not often wrong.

"It was an honour to return and I'm so glad I did," he said.

"I won't be pumping my money into the club, as a Leeds United fan I know all too well that it doesn't work long term so we are putting a business model in place that gets more people into the ground and pushes other methods of generating income.

"We'll be having events, looking at sponsorship and also holding futsal sessions for unemployed people to learn valuable life skills, to help them get a job."

And Peoplemad, too, is aimed at helping those striving for a fresh start, a new direction.

"I've set up a personal course and a professional one, though both interlink," said Phil. "It's all about attitude and motivation and includes building skills and techniques like CV writing and how to conduct yourself in an interview.

"I don't believe young people today are taught how to learn things properly, how to make notes, how to retain information. That should be the first thing they're taught before anything else."

He added: "I genuinely believe Peoplemad is a model that can be applied to anything, so whether you're a business or individual or a group it can work for you. People like thinking about their own personal development, and our success is down to what's up here (points to his head). Your whole life is in here.

"I truly believe this is so important, both to businesses and individuals, and that in turn will have a knock-on effect for the club."
